TERM DATES AND FEES FOR ALL CLASSES

Term 1: Monday 2nd September 2024 – Saturday 21st December 2024

Term 2: Monday 6th January 2025 – Saturday 5th April 2025

Term 3: Tuesday 22nd April 2025 – Saturday 19th July 2025

Duckegg Theatre Acting School runs through 42 weeks of the year breaking for 2 weeks at Christmas, 2 weeks at Easter and 6 weeks over Summer. Classes run as normal through half term weeks. Classes do **NOT** run on Bank Holiday Mondays.

ProTeam run through Easter break in order to prepare for their performance(s).

Payments for classes are split into equal averaged monthly instalments.

£22.15 - for Mini Eggs (1 hour weekly sessions)
£33.15 - for Juniors (1.5 hour weekly sessions)
£44.14 - for Seniors (2 hour weekly sessions)
£46.16 - for ProTeam (2 hour weekly sessions, x44 weeks)

Fees will be taken through the LoveAdmin system via a GoCardless direct debit mandate. Payments are split into x12 easy equal monthly instalments. Please note that payments are taken across 12 MONTHS despite us not running through August. This makes the monthly outgoing smaller but means you do pay in the month of August.

Duckegg Theatre Acting School have a one off £10.70 membership fee which is payable upon signing up (post free trial session).

From the 1st March 2025 VAT will be added to all payments.

Our notice period for leaving a group is a minimum of 4 weeks. Notice MUST be given in writing via email to the Company Director (<u>vicky@duckeggtheatre.co.uk</u>). Following receipt of written notice the following 4 weeks are payable.

CLASS SET UP

Duckegg Theatre Acting School recognise all our members are at different stages of development. Our aim is to support groups to all members are stretched but not overwhelmed. As our members become older or more mature within their groups, they will have the opportunity to take on additional production roles. Duckegg Theatre Acting School pride ourselves on our members 'falling in love with the arts'. Therefore parental support is crucial for our philosophy to work. Please encourage members to learn pieces and practice and home, and during sharings and performances applaud all groups.

Our aim is for our members to come out of class and off stage smiling, whether it was an Oscar winning performances or needed a bit of work. We have to create a safe space to fail in order for members to dare to create. It is appreciated and helpful when families continue this ethos at home and when watching performances, encouraging all the way with no judgement.

2024/25 TRAINING PLAN

At Duckegg Theatre Acting School we focus on termly objectives, worked into wider project planning, so our members learn as they 'do'.

At Miniegg level we split activities into small, 5-minute manageable chunks.

As our members get older, their activities become longer and more involved, resulting in longer and more involved work. PROTEAM work as their own theatre company, supported by a creative mentor, creating bigger scale pieces for performance.

WINTER TERM	Level 1/2 songs: vocal quality - group, vocal accuracy, musical detail, terminology, storytelling through song, musical shaping, pitching, rhythm, practitioners.
SPRING TERM	Level 1/2 songs: vocal quality - solo, terminology, communication of lyric, intonation, modulation, vocal flexibility, breath control, movement through song, practitioners.
SUMMER TERM	Putting it all together through repertoire building.
ACTING SENIORS	
WINTER TERM	Vocal control, modulation, clarity of diction, pacing, characterisation through the body, facial play, gesture, performance energy, practitioners.

SPRING TERM	Situation and place, character moods and thoughts, FFN (fluency, focus and naturalness), physicality, using performance spaces, rationale, practitioners.
SUMMER TERM	Putting it all together through repertoire building.
MUSICAL THEATRE SENIORS	
WINTER TERM	Vocal control, clarity of diction, melody accuracy, rhythm accuracy, characterisation through song, facial play, movement, gesture, performance energy, practitioners.
SPRING TERM	Place and period, character moods and thoughts, FFN (fluency, focus and naturalness), physicality through song, effective use of space, rationale, practitioners.
SUMMER TERM	Putting it all together through repertoire building.
VOICEWORKS SENIORS	
WINTER TERM	Level 2/3 songs: vocal quality - group, vocal accuracy, musical detail, terminology, storytelling through song, musical shaping, pitching, rhythm, practitioners.
SPRING TERM	Level 2/3 songs: vocal quality - solo, terminology, communication of lyric, intonation, modulation, vocal flexibility, breath control, movement through song, practitioners.

SUMMER TERM	Putting it all together through repertoire building.
PROTEAM	
WINTER TERM	Text and subtext, intentions and objectives, breath support, resonance, voice production, vocal response to characterisation, intonation and pitch, practitioners.
SPRING TERM	FFS (fluency, focus and spontaneity), advanced characterisation, creation of world, staging and performance space, R&D processes, practitioners.
SUMMER TERM	Putting it all together through repertoire building.

UNIFORM AND EQUIPMENT

SHOWS AND SOCIAL EVENTS

Duckegg Theatre Acting School members, Juniors and Seniors will work towards two performances per year which are rehearsed during their weekly classes. The first show will take place at Christmas within our class venues, allowing the opportunity to create a piece catered for a more intimate space and performance style. Previously groups have created: immersive or pantomime style pieces as well as changing the stage layout to traverse or in the round. The second performance will be at the end of Summer term at a theatre. The End of Year show is an opportunity to produce a piece for a larger venue with a traditional stage set up. Previously our groups have produced Mini Musicals, devised plays, scripted pieces, to name a few. All further information regarding rehearsals and performances will be sent to members during the Academic year.

Four our younger Mini Egg students, parent/carers will be invited to view class at the end of each term. Dates will be shared in due course.

ProTeam work on one larger scale performance per year. For 2024/25 the team have gained a place with National Theatre Connections. As part of the scheme the team will be working on a brand new play for various performances in addition to some extra opportunities such as workshops with National Theatre Directors.

Through the year our members may also be invited to take part or audition for professional work and/or partake in extra performance opportunities and experiences. These opportunities will be advertised on social media and sent out via email.

During class viewings, socials and shows, other parents may wish to photograph/ video their child participating in class during the viewing sessions for their personal record and your child may be included in these images. If we have granted permissions from all parents/carers photograph and video will be permitted. Teachers will advise at the start of the viewing as appropriate. Full details on photo permissions are included at registration on LoveAdmin and preferences will be followed.

LAMDA

Duckegg Theatre Acting School offer the option of taking solo LAMDA exams in addition to your weekly class. You must have been a member of a weekly Duckegg Junior or above class for a minimum of 1 term before starting work towards a solo exam.

Should you wish to work towards a LAMDA exam with us you must book a minimum of 4 1/2 hour 1-1 sessions with Vicky to prepare in addition to home practice. All LAMDA tuition and exams will take place online due to the wide area of which we operate. This is also a great opportunity for our members to work on a different performance style, for video or online call. The need for this is ever growing in our industry with the majority of first round auditions taking place via self-tape.

Please note solo LAMDA exams come with additional fees. If LAMDA exams are of interest please contact your area vicky@duckeggtheatre.co.uk for further information.

PHOTOGRAPHERS

Duckegg Theatre Acting School may use freelance photographers/videographers for our photoshoots and commissions to promote our work. The photos/videos will be used by Duckegg Theatre Acting School only, for up to 6 years. Once taken, the photos/videos are the intellectual property of the photographer/videographer and will be stored safely as part of their archive of work indefinitely. The photographer/videographer does not have permission to use these images in any other way. The photographer/videographer is responsible as a trading business/company to follow the General Data Protection Act 2018 and current GDPR legislation.

All professional photos and/or videos acquired from performances or events are funded by Duckegg Theatre Acting School. We do not charge our families photo or video fees. Please note the amount of photos or footage acquired is dependent on the package Duckegg has paid for from the professional photographer. The amount can vary due to our budget and the individual photographer's method (they all have their own policy).

Photography/video consent is entirely optional and families MUST note their preference on their JoinIn account. All preferences will be followed.

ABSENCES

If you are unable to attend class:

If you are unable to attend class please contact your creative mentor via their email to help them plan accordingly. If you are unable to contact us in advance please email retrospectively so we can note this on system.

TOILET TRIPS

Where possible we advise students use the toilet prior to class so do not need to leave the class mid session. Mini and Junior parents please ensure your child has gone to the toilet before class commences. Students are allowed to use the toilet during class time but will miss out on valuable lesson time and we want to minimise this as much as possible.

LOST PROPERTY

MEMBER CODE OF CONDUCT

Duckegg Theatre Acting School aims to create a positive, friendly and happy environment for members to perform and learn in, that fosters good relationships, encourages effective learning for all and creates the opportunity for all participants to thrive, enjoy performing and gain resilience and confidence.

All members will:

• Act in a considerate and courteous manner to staff and fellow members at all times.

- Avoid aggressive or bullying behaviour.
- Provide an example of good conduct for others to follow that includes:
- being polite and respectful of others
- using appropriate and inoffensive verbal and physical language

- participate in classes with professionalism, care for others, and respect the environment and premises.
- Learn any lines given independently.
- Respect each other's right to personal privacy.
- Apply themselves in rehearsal, listen and pay attention, take suggestions and try hard the first time.
- Be accepting of and open to expectations with regards to individual training and be willing to accept constructive criticism or suggestions.
- Develop resilience to adverse situations.
- Take responsibility for their own actions.
- Put their point of view across sensibly and sensitively.
- Speak with their creative mentor if they have any questions or concerns regarding class work.
- Speak with any member of staff if they have concerns relating to issues with other participants or issues away from their class work.
- Inform the creative mentor or principal (where applicable) of any injury or illness prior to the beginning of class or immediately during class. It is the member's responsibility to stop, notify the teacher and seek help.
- Do any assigned homework and practice at home.
- Wear the correct clothing and have all necessary equipment with you.
- Notify us of any absence and reason for absence.

All members will not:

- Use any equipment without permission/supervision from your creative mentor.
- Be obsessed with who has the most lines. This is not an indication of the size of your role in a professional arts setting and it isn't with us.
- Run or shout in the venues unless instructed to by a creative mentor.

Each member contributes to the energy of the class. No member has the right to lower the energy level of other members or of the class. All members should come into group willing to learn, improve, concentrate, and work to their maximum effort. Members are expected to apply themselves, learn their lines independently, listen, take suggestions and try hard.

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Please be aware that Duckegg Theatre Acting School classes can become busy and the foyer areas are usually public spaces. Mini and Junior pupils should be accompanied by an adult in the foyer area until the creative mentor collects them for class. Members will be brought back to the foyer area by the creative mentor after class and signed out. Senior and ProTeam pupils may make their own way to and from sessions if we have parent/carer permission for this. If you wish to grant permission for this please email your creative mentor. Mini and Junior pupils MUST always be picked up and dropped off by an adult. All pupils will remain at the class venue for the duration of their session, regardless of age.

Please park with consideration, for safety of all our members and members of the public.
